



ONLINE BUSINESS B2B: CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

When B2B Goes B2C

E-commerce has dramatically changed the way consumers seek information and buy products. Consumers use their smartphones 24/7 for a lot of reasons and shopping is one of them. Besides FMCG (fast moving consumer goods), online market shares exceed 10 percent throughout most categories, going up to 35 or even 40 percent for some products and they are still growing pretty fast. What does this mean for the B2B sector? Will electrical wholesalers be affected by the same development as seen in the retail sector? What can B2B learn from B2C?

Axel Voss is a trained lawyer, lecturer and current MEP. Upon re-election as Member of the European Parliament in 2014, Mr. Voss became a Vice-Chair of the Committee on Legal Affairs, then the Coordinator for the EPP Group in January 2017. He is substitute member in the Committee of Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs. During his first legislative term as MEP (2009-2014), the European Data Protection Package was a crucial element of his parliamentary work.

DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY (IP) CHALLENGES IN OUR INDUSTRY

The huge potential of a full digitalization for our democracy, society and economy is well known. However, what is essential are concrete and comprehensive projects that fully include digital elements in our life. In order to be competitive by modern standards, European companies need to come up with innovative products, as well as services, and go new creative ways empowered by digital technologies.

Intellectual property is of course a very controversial issue with strong interests from many different sides. At the same time, we have to provide clear regulations on the economic use of copyright protected content, as well as personal data. It is our obligation to find a proper balance between the protection of the individual user and the innovative measures within the technical progress.

WORLD CONFERENCE CENTER BONN

Platz der Vereinten Nationen 2, 53113 Bonn, Germany

The World Conference Center Bonn encompasses the Main Building together with the Plenary Building. The combination of modern architecture and first-class facilities enables events of every sort to be held for up to 7,000 people. The WorldCCBonn is located in the middle of Bonn's former government quarter next to the river Rhine.

The Plenary Chamber where the German Parliament met from 1992 to 1999 is located right beside the Rhine. Today the Plenary Chamber has capacity for events with up to 1,230 people. The Plenary Chamber with the benches for parliamentary groups, the government bench, the Bundesrat and the presidium has 730 seats. The visitors' gallery can seat 495 people. With the transparent effect created by the glass construction and its harmonious integration into the cityscape, the Plenary Chamber is considered to be one of the most beautiful buildings in the world. It comes across as being filled with daylight, as well as friendly and cosmopolitan.

The glass walls and light steel construction create a lively atmosphere suffused by light, symbolising democracy and political transparency. The large glass facades allow a direct view of the Rhine and the opposite bank.

The glass-roofed, square hall provides circular seating. It is bordered by airy and transparent two-story lobbies and the building of the Bundestag President on the Rhine side, whose horizontal structural outline blends into the Rhine shoreline landscape.



BONN City of Beethoven and Former Capital of Germany



BONN, A WELCOMING CITY

Bonn is a dynamic, youthful city with a remarkable history. It comfortably combines international flair with Rhineland joie de vivre and modern architecture with historic buildings. It is these contrasts that give the city its attractive face. The Romanesque Minster church with its 900-year-old cloister, the Old Town Hall in Rococo style, the electoral palaces which now form part of the University of Bonn or the modern Post Tower are just some of the highlights. So set off and visit, and discover all the diversity Bonn has to offer.

For around 50 years, Bonn was the capital city of the Federal Republic of Germany. The former parliament and government district, known today as the federal district, with the Palais Schaumburg, Villa Hammerschmidt and Chancellor's Bungalow, stands as a symbol for the first successful democracy in Germany. Bonn is the second site of national government today, but has also evolved successfully into a centre for international cooperation and a location for global enterprises. The former Plenary Chamber of the Federal Parliament, now the World Conference Center Bonn, is a popular congress venue. Since 1996. Bonn has also been Germany's hitherto only UNO city.

BONN - BEETHOVEN CITY

Ludwig van Beethoven is not just Bonn's most famous son, but his birthplace in Bonngasse also houses the largest Beethoven collection worldwide, with paintings, music scores and instruments providing a vivid picture of the life and outstanding works of the composer. Located very nearby is the Chamber music hall, a venue whose outstanding acoustics have given it a reputation as one of the most sophisticated concert halls in Europe.
